Just before the RoadHoG Bus went back on the road, we held a prayer time at Boston Baptist Church, which was attended by 26 people – it was such an extraordinarily good time that we have been asked to make it a regular fixture on the RoadHoG diary. As ever Tony Coe has excelled himself this season with the Crafts – particularly when it comes to making a mess! Our first craft of the season was making juggling balls by filling balloons with dry rice – it amazes me just how much rice can get into just about every crevice on the bus,. The second – making cupcakes - was only very slightly less messy, but definitely more tasty! Our thanks to Tony for preparing the craft so selflessly for us week on week.

This sort of work requires a dedicated and skilled youth worker and we have been seeking God's guidance regarding appointing someone on a part-time basis for a while now. At their last Board Meeting, Lincolnshire Youth Mission agreed that Schools Work should be a priority for RoadHoG and they have agreed to finance the appointment of a part-time Schools Worker. As a consequence, an advert has been placed on-line and we pray that God will provide His person to fill the vacancy – please join with us in prayer for God's leading.
