Schools Work Update:

Tony has created four lessons (with an optional fun, or “treat” lesson for post-SATS week) that focus on i) personal direction of life, ii) the ability to transform and be transformed, iii) the ingredients essential to creating good community and (iv) support with changing friendships in the transitional process from Primary to Secondary Education. Each lesson stands on its own or they can be delivered at regular times during the Spring and Summer term leading up to the children changing schools. This is what a couple of schools wrote about the work in 2018:

“The Year 6 pupils gained so much from each of the RoadHoG visits in terms of personal faith, identity and understanding. The visits provided a safe and welcoming environment in which the pupils felt at ease to explore and question issues relating to what it means to be human. The topics covered were well-suited to the Year 6 groups and tied in with themes that we wanted to pursue with the children, i.e. Journeys of life, Community, and Transition from primary school to secondary school.
