The project has had a fantastic summer, despite our faithful bus limping a bit at times. In the summer term, the bus has visited eight schools, on numerous occasions. In June and July, the project made contact with 1145 young people and during our community visits prayed with 28 young people.

One memorable day, I travelled to St Mary's Swineshead, to deliver two lessons, followed by St. Nicholas Academy in the afternoon and topped off by a community to visit to Woad Farm in the evening. I have never poured so much water into the cooling system of the bus, just to get me from A to B! Fortunately the next week, John put some 'super-snot' in, which has given the engine cylinder head gasket a bit longer life....but for how long!
