Life on the bus

The other day, someone mentioned that these Newsletters are all "upbeat" and they asked me whether we ever have any problems at our various Stops – and, of course, the answer is that we do have problems, but by God's amazing grace they all seem to resolve themselves eventually.

We have recently had a number of incidents of bad behavior at a number of Stops – none of which appear to be linked – but all have resulted in our having to exclude youngsters for a number of visits of the Bus. Their exclusion is not our attempting to "punish" the youngsters – that's certainly not in our remit – but we do attempt to modify their behavior for their greater good and also that of the other youngsters who attend the Bus.

We have learned that exclusion from the Bus for a week or two, comes as a great shock to the youngsters, because we take away from them something that they want – time on the Bus with their friends. Schools often exclude pupils, but that is often to the young people's delight, as they usually view exclusion from school as an extra holiday and something boast to their friends about...

We have welcomed a huge number of young people aboard the roadHoG Bus this year, both at our local Stops and also at the various schools that Tony visits - and none of this would be possible without such a dedicated Team of workers.

The next day, John Cropley and Tony Coe had a dig around in the generator cupboard (having had to remove most of the kitchen first so that they could get at it) and – THEY FIXED IT! Thanks guys – we are all so grateful to you both for that – problem over?

No - the problem was not over! Because whilst everything ran well on the Monday evening at the Woad Farm Stop, at the Bus's next outing at Fishtoft, the heater refused to start up and the interior lights all dimmed down to almost nothing! Fortunately, or Bus engineer, Ben was with us and so he and I pulled out the seating to find that for some reason the battery charger had decided not to work - maybe it hadn't liked the slightly unstable voltage that my little generator had provided it with at Kirton – who knows?
