## **IT'S BEEN A BUSY SUMMER!**

Over the past few months, I have been very privileged to speak about roadHoG at Holy Trinity Church in Boston, Boston Baptist Church and New Life Community Church in Kirton. I have been able to tell folk about how, by God's grace, we obtained our lovely new Bus and to share with them the amazing the numbers of young people we were able to welcome aboard in the first twelve months of it being on the road.



I was also able to share with them a few verses of Scripture that explain pretty much why we do, what we do and to keep it simple, I've honed it down three passages, which I would like to share with you too.

Firstly, from 2 Corinthians 5:17-21, the fact that all Christians are called to be Ambassadors of God. As those whose true home is in the Heavenly Realm, we are called to represent our home to those who reside solely within this world. That means being careful how we act, showing care and compassion to those we meet and – of course – speaking well about our true home and seeking peace through the reconciliation between our two lands which is only made possible by the death, resurrection and ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ. As roadHoG we seek to be Ambassadors of Christ to the youngsters that we meet.

Secondly, from Luke 5:27–32, we recognise that Jesus went to the places where His message of God's offer of reconciliation was needed the most. He went to the home of a Tax Collector – the most despised people of that time – we go to the places where youngsters who need us the most are to be found, those who would otherwise possibly never have contact with Christians or the message of the Gospel.

Thirdly, from Matthew 5:3-9, we view ourselves as the Sower in Jesus's parable. The Sower simply sowed the seeds – he didn't discriminate between one piece of ground or another, he simply did as he was instructed and sowed the seeds. At roadHoG, we don't discriminate between any youngster who comes our way, each and every one of them has the opportunity to hear about Jesus, and to ask questions. Like the sower in Jesus's parable, we simply sow the seeds of the Gospel.

## RoadHoG in Practice

At both Boston Baptist Church and New Life, John was able to tell the folk about an encounter he recently had had with a young man at one of our Stops. This young chap was a bully, was rude, crude and openly offensive, to the point where he had been banned from attending the Bus on a number of occasions. This young man had previously entered the prayer room on the Bus on a number of occasions and had been rude, troublesome and provocative to the Team Members in there, but this time was different. On this particular evening in the prayer room he told his story, a story of a difficult home life, problems with drugs and alcohol and number of other things too, culminating in a request to John to pray for him as he tries to turn his life around. Will he succeed? By God's grace and our prayers, only God knows, but it would appear that his journey has begun, let's pray that he successfully turns his life around – and finds Jesus Christ as his Saviour.



That reminds me of a story a very wise Police Officer once told me. She told me of boarding the Bus one evening to see one of the most difficult youngsters she had ever had to deal with, sat at a table playing a board game with a Team Member. For the first time she saw him as he truly was, not the already hardened criminal her previous encounters with him had shown him to be, someone who should be punished for his actions, but instead she saw him for who he really was – simply a child and a child in need of help and understanding.
